Do the crossword puzzle as a class exercise where you write the answers on the whiteboard.

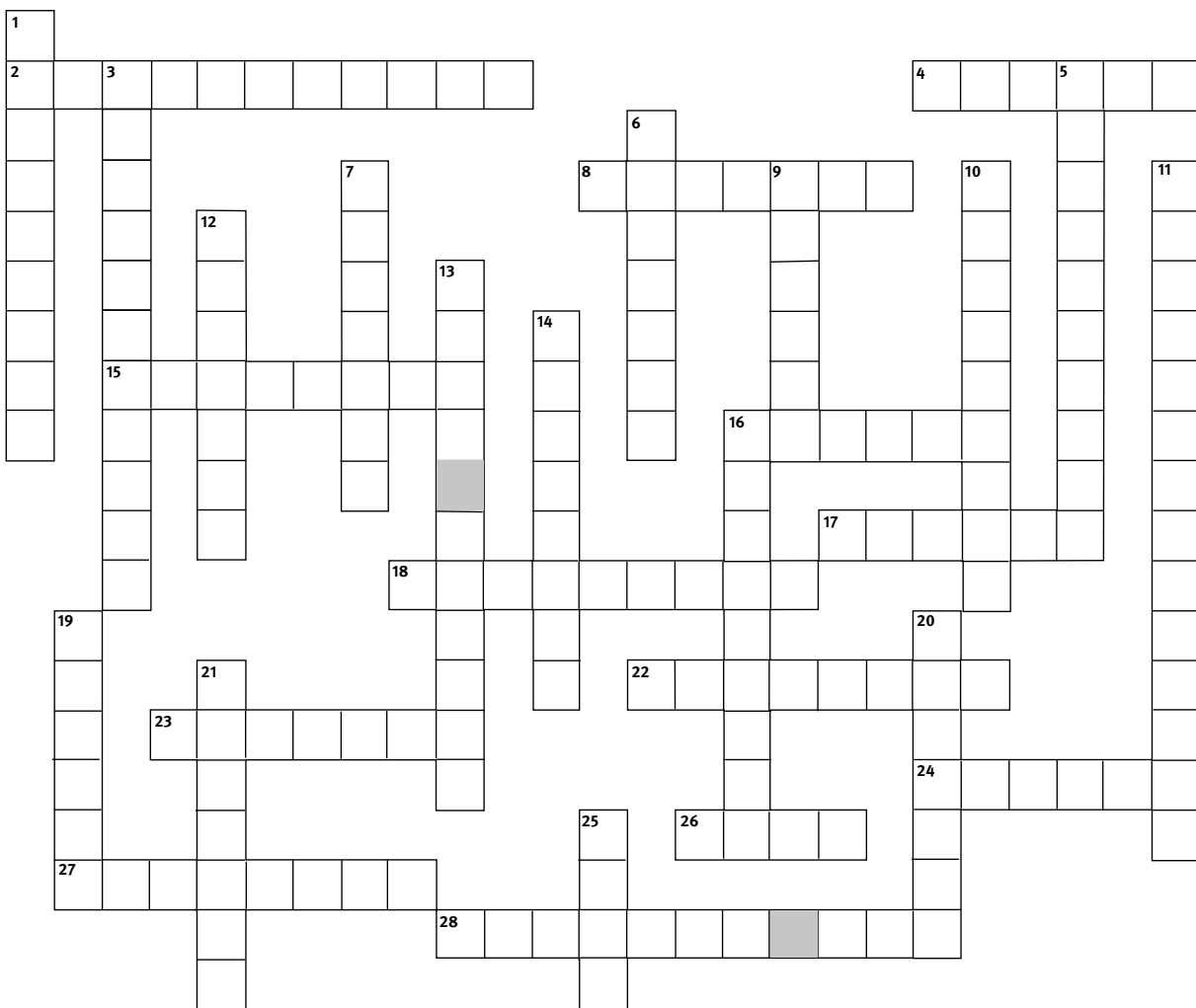
