Nautical Adventurer.—On Monday afternoon last, during the flowing of the tide, the attention of the boatmen and some passengers, who were preparing to cross at the Alloa ferry, was directed to an object sailing up the river Forth, which afforded them much conjecture—

A valuable Curiosity.—It is stated in the National Intelligencer, that Mr Rich, Consul of the United States at Valencia, has obtained possession of the original manuscript of Columbus's account of his First Voyage to America. This is worth all the manuscripts of Herculaneum; and to the inhabitants of the new world it will be a most interesting document. A Wooden Clock at Lutakoo.—Some time ago the Missionary Society sent to the King of Lutakoo, South Africa, a present of a wooden clock, with three little figures which strike bells, at the hours and quarters.
