Nautical Adventurer.—On Monday afternoon last, during the flowing of the tide, the attention of the boatmen and some passengers, who were preparing to cross at the Alloa ferry, was directed to an object sailing up the river Forth, which afforded them much conjecture—

The direction of the tide however to the north quay, soon neared it sufficiently to discover, that the supposed boat was a large mass of ice, about 2 feet above the water, and that the adventurous seamen, who occasionally raised his head and looked how the land lay, was no other than a large seal. Judging that hostilities were certainly intended, he very prudently leaped overboard.

A valuable Curiosity.—It is stated in the National Intelligencer, that Mr Rich, Consul of the United States at Valencia, has obtained possession of the original manuscript of Columbus's account of his First Voyage to America. This is worth all the manuscripts of Hericlaneum; and to the inhabitants of the new world it will be a most interesting document. Mr Rich resides not far from the port from which the illustrious navigator took his departure, on his first voyage of discovery. The manuscript, it is said, will be translated and published in the Spanish and English languages, and the original deposited in the Capitol of the United States, at Washington.—*American Paper.*

A Wooden Clock at Latakoo.—Some time ago the Missionary Society sent to the King of Latakoo, South Africa, a present of a wooden clock, with three little figures which strike bells, at the hours and quarters.
