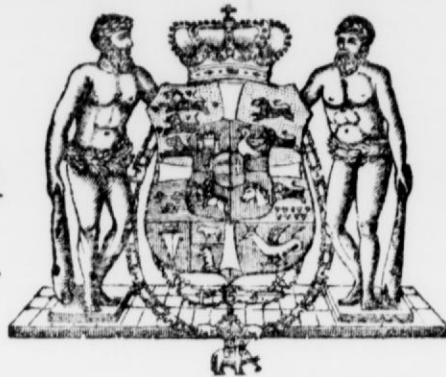

Aaret 1834.

Ifølge den kongelige vestindiske Regjerings Ordre, vil Mandtalslistens Optagelse, begynde den 10de November næstkommende.

Undertegnede Commission møder ved ethvert Huus i Byerne, hvor det Fornødne af Eier eller Leier maa paavises, og forventer Commissionen, at enhver Eier eller dennes Fuldmægtig, vil være tilstæde, naar Commissionen indfærdede sig, og afgive de fornødne Oplysninger, hvorved saavel Uvished for Commissionen, som Bøder for de Vedkommende, i flere Tilfælde vil udgaaes.

Commissionen indfinder sig derefter paa det Kongelige Kasserer Contoir, hvor Listerne for Byen Christiansted modtages, Protocollerne opføres og Negerskatten betales.

Commissionens Forretninger begynde i Byerne Klokken 8te om Morgenen og paa Landet Klokken 9, paa de nedenfor bestemte Dage, og continueres indtil Middag.

Forordningerne af 11te November 1776, 16de Julii 1778, 13de April 1779, 16de Martz 1792 og 1ste Octbr. 1802, samt General Gouverneurs Placat af 10de November 1823, med Undtagelse af den Deel der vedkommer Betalings Terminerne af Kop Skatten, bestemme Grund Reglerne for Afgivernes Erlæggelse af Eiendomme i Vestindien, hvoraf følgende ved Skattelists Optagelse, maa iagttages.

At Negerne som forties med Forsæt, bortsaelles til Fordeel for den Kongelige Kasse, og Angiveren, om Nogen er.

At Kopskatten som svares med 64 Skilling af Negerne i Byerne, og med 1 Rd. 32 Sk. af hver Neger af Mandkiønnet paa Plantagerne til Kongens Kasse, og med 1 Rd. af hver Byeneger og 2 Rd. af hver Neger af Mandkiønnet paa Landet til Landkassen, erlægges hvad som er under 20 Rd. strax ved Skattelists Optagelse, men hvad som er 20 Rd. og derover paa den i Forordningen af 11te November 1776 befalede Maade.

At af Negerne fødte eller døde i Aarets Løb ingen Skatter svares, men bliver desuagtet nøiagtigen at føre paa Listerne, derimod svares Skatter af alle andre Negerne, inclusive Invalider.

Nøiagtige Lister over Byenegerne, med Af- og Tilgangs Bemærkninger, ere af Vedkommende at forfatte, og til Commissionen at indgive, ligeledes for Plantagerne, med rigtig Opgivende, hvormegit Land i Sukker, og hvormegit i anden Dyrkning, og maa enhver Liste, saavel for Husene i Byerne, som Plantagerne paa Landet, tillige indeholde samtlige Beboeres Navne, saavel Blanke som Friefolk. Og da

det hænder sig at Eierne af Negerne opgive disse til Skat paa andre Steder end deres Boepæce, saa maa det til Efterretning ved Skatternes Indkrævelse, opgives hvor Eierne boe, og Anledningen til at Negerne ikke opgives der.

Til Lættelse ved disse Listers Afgivelse, og for at erholde samme saa nøiagtige som muelig, er der af den Kongelige Vestindiske Regjering foranstaltet trykket et tilstrækkeligt Antal Schemata, som udeliveres uden Betaling her i Byen og for Christiansted's Jurisdiction, paa Borgerraadets Incassator Contoir, og i Frederiksted og for sammes Jurisdiction paa Frederiksted's Politiekammer.

I Byerne paalægges det desuden enhver Huuseier, skriftligen at navngive sig som saadan for Commissionen, at ikke denne skal geraade i Uvished, hvo der til sin Tid skal erlægge Bygningskatten, ligeledes paalægges det de Huuseiere, hvis Huse have staaet ledige eller udfærdede i 6 Maaneder eller længere Tid, og som desaaarsag ønske Nedsættelse i Skatterne, derom at fremkomme med tilstrækkeligt Bevis for deres Andragendes Rigtighed, saaledes at Commissionen, kan tilføre det Nødige i Protocollen.

Det bemærkes at Commissionen ikke antager andre Lister af Skatteydere, end saadanne som ere indrettede i Overeenstemmelse med de ovenfor anførte Schemata, og behørigt udfyldte; dog følger det af sig selv, at dette ikke gælder om Huuseiere, som ikke selv beboe deres Huse, hvilke ifølge det ny-aufførte alene have at anmelde dem for Commissionen som Eiere, da det i saa Henseende er tilstrækkeligt, at Anmeldelsen viser hvem Eierne er, samt til hvem Huset er leiet, eller i hvis Besiddelse det befindes — Iøvrigt maa en separat af Vedkommende underskreven Liste, indleveres for ethvert Huus eller Plantage.

Husene i begge Byer bør være tydeligen nummererede, og Gadehjørnene paa hver Side være forsynede med læselige Gadenavne, og det bemærkes frendedes, at efter General Gouverneur CLAUSEN'S Placat 4te Januar 1777, skal saavel Nummerne paa Husene, som Gadenavnene, være anbragte med hvid Farve paa sort Grund, eller omvendt.

I Tilfælde af befindende Mængder, vil følgende Bøder blive at erlægge og ved Execution at indrive:

10 Rd. for hver Dagen Liste, det være sig for Byerne eller Plantagerne udebliver, og Eiere der give Lister som ikke indeholde de befalede Oplysninger, saaledes som i de omtalte Schemata er opgivet, vil paadrage sig samme Pengestraf.

Samme Mulct finder Sted for de Huuseiere i Byerne, som ikke skriftligen anmelde sig som saadanne.

10 Rd. for hvert manglende eller utydeligt Nummer og Gade Navn i Byerne.

Den Kop Skat som ikke er erlagt inden 24 Timer efter Skattelists Optagelse, vil forsaavidt den ikke overstiger 20 Rd. blive inddrevet ved Execution.

Iøvrigt vil Vedkommende medbringe det nøiagtige Beløb af den betalbare Skat til enhver Incassator især, da Tiden ikke tilhæder det Opoid det medtager at vexle.

Sluttelig refereres til den, efter den kongelige vestindiske Regjerings Befaling i Avisen af 26de Septbr. 1833, indrykkede Bekjendtgørelse, saa lydende:

“Da det Kongelige General Toldkammer og Commerce Collegium, paa Grund af en af den Kongelige Vestindiske Regjering gjort Indstilling om Skattefriebed af Land, som aldeles ikke dyrkes, men enten afbenyttes til Græsgang eller henligger ubrugt, havde paalagt Regjeringen om, hvormegit Landareal herpaa Öen, kan henregnes til Land, som ovenmeldt, nemlig, som aldeles ikke dyrkes, men afbenyttes til Græsgang, eller henligger ubrugt eller öde, samt om, hvad som aldeles ikke nu eller i Fremtiden kan anvendes til noget som helst Brug, blev i denne Anledning et Avertissement i October Maaned 1831 indført i Avisen, indeholdende, at Vedkommende havde til Skattecommissionen at opgive, hvilket og hvormegit af deres Landareal afbenyttes til Græsgang og hvad som aldeles ikke da eller i Fremtiden kunde anvendes til noget som helst Brug; men det medførte ikke den tilsigtede Nytte.

Da nu Tiden nærmer sig, paa hvilken Skatten skal bestemmes for indevaerende Aar, saa advares Alle og Enhver, som maatte have Land af den anførte Beskaffenhed og som ønsker at fritages for Skattesvarelse deraf, til Skattecommissionen, naar samme holdes i de vedkommende Quarterer, under Eeds Tilbud, at opgive fornøden Forklaring, samt som Bevis for Rigtigheden deraf, at forskaffe den vedkommende

Quarter Capitains Attest, eller om denne ei kan erholdes, da sine Naboers Vidnesbyrd, ligeledes under Eeds Tilbud.”

(TRANSLATION.)

By order of the royal westindia government, the tax commission will commence to take up the capitation list on the 11th November next.

The undersigned commissioners will appear at such house in the towns, where every elucidation requisite is to be given by the owner or occupier, and it is expected that every owner will appear for that purpose either in person or by representative, when the commissioners call at the houses, by which in many instances may be avoided uncertainty for the commissioners and fines for the concerned.

The commissioners will afterwards meet, for the town of Christiansted, at the royal head treasurer's office, where the lists are to be delivered, the needful be entered in the protocols, and the capitation tax be paid.

The hour of meeting fixed for both towns is 8 o'clock in the morning, and in the country at 9, on the beneath mentioned days, and to continue till noon.

IN THE COUNTRY.

Tuesday the 25th Nov. for ditto in Kings and Northside quarters Let. B. at the estate Cliftonhill, belonging to Major P. Markoes children.

FREDERIKSTED.

Wednesday the 10th Dec. to commence in Frederiksfort and continue through strand street, from No. 1 to 41, and from No. 1 to 35 in kings street.

Thursday the 11th Dec. from No. 36 to 71 in kings street, and from No. 1 to 37 in queens street.

Friday the 12th Dec. from No. 38 to 71 in queens street, and from No. 1 to 52 Let. B. in princes street.

Saturday the 13th Dec. from No. 53 to 74 in princes street, from No. 1 to 68 in hospital street, in new street from No. 1 to 32 Let. A. & B. fisher street, queens cross street No. 1 and Market street from No. 1 to 3.

The ordinance of 11th Nov. 1776, 18th July 1778, 13th April 1779, 16th March 1792, and the 1st Oct. 1802, have together with the governor general's placard of the 10th Nov. 1823, with the exception of the instalments for paying the capitation tax laid down the manner in which payment of taxes on properties in the westindies are to be paid, and the following rules are to be observed:

The Negroes willfully not given up by their owners or by those persons in whose possession they are, will be sold for account of the king, and the informer, if any.

The capitation tax to the royal treasury is 64sk. W. C. for each town negro and Ps. 1 32sk for each male negro in the country, and to the land treasury Ps. 1 for each town negro, and Ps. 2 for each male negro in the country, to be paid thus: Capitation tax not amounting to Ps. 20 immediately on taking up the list, but if Ps. 20 and above that sum, in the manner specified in the ordinance of the 11th November 1776.

That negroes born or dead in the course of the year, are not taxable, but they are notwithstanding to be regularly specified in the lists delivered.—All other negroes are taxable, including invalids.

Exact lists of the town negroes together with increase or decrease, &c. &c. are to be delivered to the commissioners. In like manner the lists of the estates must be made out with a true specification of the number of acres in canes, and in any other cultivation, together with the name of the present owners, and further (as directed for the towns,) a specification of all the inhabitants.

For the convenience of the community, and in order to obtain as much regularity as possible in the tax lists, schemes have been printed by order of the royal government, which schemes will be delivered gratis for the town of Christiansted and its jurisdiction at the burgher council's incassator's office, and in the town of Frederiksted and its jurisdiction, at the police office of that town.

It is a duty incumbent on every owner of a house to announce himself as such in writing to the commission, to prevent any doubt, who is to pay the house tax; and it is further directed, that owners of houses, that have been vacant or untenanted for six months or upwards, and in consequence thereof are desirous to get a proportional reduction in their taxes, are for that purpose to come forward with sufficient proof of their assertion, in order to enable the commissioners to observe the needful in the protocol.

It is to be observed, that the commission will receive no tax lists, except they are made out according to the above mentioned schemes, and every column properly filled up. It is however understood, that such lists are not required from owners of houses, who have only to announce themselves as such to the commission, though not occupying their houses, as in such cases it will be considered sufficient, when they announce themselves together with the names of the persons who occupy the house, in writing to the commissioners.

Separate lists, duly signed by the owner or occupier for each house or plantation, is to be delivered to the commission, notwithstanding the concerned individual might own more than one house or plantation.

All houses in both towns are to be numbered, and the name of the streets to be placed on both sides of the corner houses, painted with white on black ground or vice versa, in a conspicuous manner, according to governor general CLAUSEN's placard of 4th January 1777.

In case of non-compliance with the above, the following fines are to be paid and levied for:—

Ten pieces of eight for every list that is not rendered in due time, be it either in town or country, and proprietors giving in the lists which do not contain the explanations directed, according to the before mentioned schemes will be subjected to the same fine, as the lists, in such cases will be returned to them.

Owners of houses in towns, who neglect announcing themselves as such in writing are liable to the same fine.

Ten pieces of eight for every house numbered that are either wanted or illegible, and the same for every street name having the same defect.

For all unpaid capitation tax under Ps. 20, a levy will be made within 24 hours after the time, when the lists ought to have been delivered to the commissioners.—Finally, all persons are requested to bring the exact amount of the capitation tax to be paid to each treasury, as the time will not allow to make change.

Referring finally to the publication, conformably to order of the royal Government, inserted in the Island Gazette of 26th September 1833, as follows:

"In consequence of a representation from the royal westindia government to the royal board of trade and commerce, regarding the exemption of such land from taxes as is uncultivated, or only used for pasturage, or entirely barren: the royal government has been enjoined to report what quantity of acres of land in this island are at present uncultivated, used for pasturage, or entirely barren, or at present as well as hereafter may be considered useless for any purpose whatever.

In furtherance hereof, a publication was issued in the month of October 1831, by which proprietors of such land were notified, that they had to report to the tax commission what quantity of the land was used for pasturage, as also what quantity in future might be considered unfit for any purposes, but which publication had not the desired effect.

As the time is now approaching for assessing the taxes for the present year, all concerned who own land of the above description, and who are desirous to be exempted from taxes thereon, are requested to render a statement thereof to the tax-commission

when held in the respective quarters; which statements are to be attested on oath if required, as also to be certified by the captains of the respective quarters, or if that cannot be obtained, by certificates from the neighbours on oath if required."
